# FROM OUR LEAD PASTOR JASON KOLEBA

There is a time for everything,

and a season for every activity under the heavens....

I have seen the burden God has laid on the human race. He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end.

**Ecclesiastes 3** 

In March 2020, humans beings entered into an unforeseen, difficult and puzzling "time". People everywhere, rich and poor, have experienced rapid change and a perplexing sense of disorientation. It is impossible, as Ecclesiastes observes, to discern what God is doing. How does this fit in his master plan? How is this season of pandemic and uncertainty beautiful in its time? Despite our inability to get a clear answer, God invites us to seek and trust him (Eccl. 3:14). If he can make something beautiful from a cross and tomb, then he can certainly do something wonderful in "these times". There is already evidence that he is doing so.

Even before the shared life of our church family was shaken in late winter, God was up to new things. In November, our long-time (and deeply loved!) Pastor of People Care, Larry Charter, retired from full-time ministry. Our leaders launched two new groups— Bonafide and Day 6 — designed to enable women to grow closer to Jesus and one another. With plans to bring its unique mix of adventure and challenge to Canada, a contingent of women ventured to South Africa to participate in Arise. The newly branded WING Men continued to grow and press men to live life authentically. God sparked a vision in several our men to take on the Everest-sized challenge of human trafficking. By February, Freedom 8848 was born in Cochrane.

Although our plans took an unexpected detour in March, the Spirit wasn't caught sleeping! Within a few short weeks of the outbreak, we took our services and ministries online and introduced a brand-new TV Channel. In response to many emerging needs around us, the Community Ambassador Initiative was launched. Dozens of us were recruited and equipped to reach-out practically to those in our church and community. This resulted in everything from grocery delivery, to prayer support to simple human conversations over the phone. In May, we offered Alpha for the second time in 2020. Hosting Alpha online gave more people access to the course than ever before with participants join from Alberta, the Maritimes, the US and even Central America. A number of those people took significant steps in their spiritual lives leading to our first "socially distant" Bow River baptisms in June. We praise God for the ten people who took the cold plunge that day. Despite the economic challenges many of us are facing, Cochrane Alliance responded generously to the needs of others facing hardship around the world. Approximately \$12,000 was raised and invested in projects around the world—from the Fort City Flood Response Fund in northern Alberta to food hamper initiatives for Rohingya in SE Asia and Guatemalans in our partner church in San Raymundo.



Although we can't control or accurately predict what will happen in the "times" ahead, this annual report serves an important purpose for our church community. As we look back at the goodness and faithfulness of God in a uniquely tumultuous year, we can take courage going forward. God is weaving our narrative together according to his good purposes. He will make everything beautiful in its time. May he sustain and encourage us as we continue the adventure.

### TV CHANNEL LAUNCH

In December 2019, WorldPlay generously invited our church into a one year pilot project to provide a TV channel for our viewers. This project would give a "Netflix" type platform of a variety of videos and livestreaming to our congregation. The big launch was planned for March 22. With the height of the pandemic upon us, our new TV channel, with its livestreaming and videos, became our primary means of communication to the congregation. Before the TV channel and COVID-19, we rarely shared videos beyond our livestream services. As our TV channel launched, we increased our output to several videos per week, including updates on what was happening in the church overall, JAM kids and youth teaching, updates from international workers, devotionals and more! We praise God for the blessing of our pilot project with WorldPlay during this technology-driven time.





# YOUTH MINISTRY

### A FEW HIGHLIGHTS FROM PASTOR JASON

God is on the move! We are seeing his goodness and transforming power at work in the lives of youth. Let me share a few ways we have seen this. We had a strong start to the fall 2019. Some weeks, we were seeing 55 youth engage with us on Wednesday nights. It is encouraging to see new youth coming and participating with us. The youth ministry is building a strong community that is supporting one another and reaching out.

One of the most exciting things is that we are seeing youth take more leadership in the ministry. One of the highest values of this generation is that they want to be contributors not consumers. We saw this in a few ways; a youth team planned and led the majority of our Friday events, 2 missional communities (one for junior high girls and one for senior high boys) were started and led fully by youth and we also saw youth leading the teaching on Wednesday nights. The other exciting youth led ministry was an online Alpha group. Youth from our church collaborated with youth from Bow Valley Baptist to run an online youth Alpha that saw anywhere from 15-25 participate on a weekly basis.

As always, it was a highlight to bring a team of youth and leaders to Guatemala. We so value our relationship with Pastor Victor and the Jesus Viene Church. Our team taught in the school, delivered food hampers, ran a soccer tournament, and helped with other projects in the school. The real highlight though was the work God did in our team. During our trip, the team shared openly and honestly with another as they shared testimonies. Through this, deep bonds were formed and God changed hearts and lives. The highlight on our team was when one team member gave her life to Christ on the trip!













### **MEET JOCELYN HAYES**

Knowing that many seniors were feeling isolated and alone in April, our youth made it a goal to send encouragement cards to the seniors within our church. Many of our seniors pray continually for our youth and so we wanted to "flip the script" and pray for the seniors. # **DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY**

#### A FEW HIGHLIGHTS FROM PASTOR MIKE

- Alpha has exploded for us this year! With the help of 18 volunteers, we ran Alpha three ways: At two different sites in the winter and online in the spring. In total, 61 people registered, and 8 people became followers of Jesus.
- There were a ton of opportunities for women to connect and grow in their faith this year.
   Two highlights were the launch of Bonafide on Thursday mornings and Day 6 on Wednesday evenings. In total an average of 36 women gathered weekly to help each other grow.
- Every Tuesday, an average of 25 men gathered at WING Men to challenge and encourage each other.
- Many groups and ministries did the hard work of converting their gatherings to online after the
  quarantine began including a number of Life Groups, Bonafide, WING Men, and Day 6! A big thanks
  goes out to the many leaders who worked hard to continue a sense of connection and community
  through trying times.
- One of the most encouraging developments of the year was our response to the COVID-19
  pandemic. Our Community Ambassadors Initiative mobilized almost 90 volunteers from three
  different churches and the wider community to regularity check in on approximately 360
  neighbourhood households. Thank you Cochrane Alliance Church for stepping up to love
  your neighbours.! Ambassadors have made over 700 support calls to neighbours in Cochrane.

Did you know that trafficking is the fastest growing crime in the world? Freedom 8848, launched in February, is committed to bringing awareness and funds to those who are in real danger to be groomed and trafficked or to those who need rescue and restoration from sex trafficking situations.

This August, several teams will be climbing the equivalent of Mount Everest: 8848 metres over the course of 3 days. These teams are being sponsored by people like you who want to fight trafficking. Freedom 8848 has three pillars for fighting sex trafficking: Prevention, Rescue and Restoration; all funds raised will go directly to three organizations that specifically target these purposes. # **CARE MINISTRY**

### A FEW HIGHLIGHTS FROM PASTOR LARRY

- Freedom Session ministry saw 7 participants, 3 facilitators and 2 co-facilitators complete the 28 week course.
- This past year 5 couples were trained in our Marriage Mentor ministry. Each of these couples are now mentoring five other couples.
- Grief Share ministry saw 10 people attend our 13 week course as they worked through loss in their life.
- I stepped into semi-retirement as of October 30, 2019.
- Our Easter Parade Walk-By saw 60 people from our church bring greetings to residents of three local long term care facilities. Families brought homemade posters to show at the windows. Residents at Bethany Care Centre, Points West Living and Big Hill Lodge were thrilled to be remembered on Easter Weekend during the pandemic this spring.

### **MEET JON & DANELLE SCHWAB**

We sought out Marriage Mentorship with the intention of meeting with another couple who was further down the road than us in terms of stage of life, who would challenge us to grow in our marriage and help us to make our marriage a priority. We wanted to meet with a couple who we respected, who loved each other well and who we looked up to. When we initiated this, the purpose was really to grow and strengthen our marriage and to do things that would help us individually as well as together as a couple. We had a few weak areas we hoped to work at but also really wanted to strive towards having a strong and healthy marriage. By no means was our relationship perfect, but we didn't see any major problem areas.

Over this past year, this mentorship has really helped us to be intentional about investing time into our relationship. It also helped us not to just be content and coast in our marriage but to strive towards greater intimacy like God intended marriage to be. It was also a place not just to discuss failures and weaknesses in our relationships, but also helped us find ways to appreciate one another, to celebrate things that we have done well, to compliment our spouse and to encourage and build each other up. The material provided a framework for conversation and helped us to explore issues that we wouldn't normally talk about and also gave helpful ways to grow in each of those areas. One big advantage of Mentorship is the wisdom and life experience that the other couple brings. When we met and started to discuss some of the topics either in the book or even just real life stuff that was going on, it was so refreshing to hear from someone who had already been through something like that and were on the other side of it. They were able to impart wisdom from their experiences and from their personal relationship with God and that has been invaluable. It also has really helped to build our faith. As we are able to share experiences both ways, we are able to see the many ways that God works and that has been powerful. It has helped to give us perspective on areas we need to work on, what we need to strive for, things to worry about or not and has been a safe place for us to ask questions.

On a more personal note, Marriage Mentorship has been life-giving and a source of hope for us over this past year. Marriage isn't always easy and we don't always do things perfectly. We have been working through a very hard season in life in a number of areas this year and recently encountered some struggles in our marriage. The very first people we reached out to was our mentors and they have been closely journeying with us and helping us navigate our struggles. This couple has become part of our life and our family and they have provided an invaluable network of support, love and encouragement. They are able to challenge us, encourage us, remind us of truth, hold us accountable, be a listening ear, share their own struggles and experiences, pray for us, love us and they constantly point us back to Christ. Even in the struggles, there is grace, love and forgiveness and working through these struggles helps to bring us closer to true intimacy the way God intended. God has a plan and purpose for us and for our marriage. It isn't always easy and it can take a lot of hard work, but I'm so glad we have mentors who are walking alongside us.

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE TREASURER

When I look back to last year's report, I used the word "memorable", and I talked about "answering His call". A year ago, I had no idea we'd be sitting in this current situation we find ourselves in right now but those same words still ring true.

Living in the midst of a worldwide pandemic. Has been memorable! With job loss and reduction of hours for many, the Board of Elders & Finance Committee made plans for a significant impact to the church financial bottom line. But as the fiscal year progressed, God's people continued to give faithfully, to a point where we even had a small surplus at the end of the 2019 – 2020 fiscal year!

As the Board of Elders and Finance
Committee prepared to "batten down the hatches" per se, the call went out to pray for financial stability and sustainability, and prayerfully contribute if you are able - and give you did! God's faithful people answered His call. On behalf of the Board of Elders and Finance Committee THANK YOU again

for such faithful giving. Without you, we could never carry on ministry in our town.

When the pandemic hit, the Western Canadian District of the C&MA graciously granted our request to decrease our monthly mortgage payments. Our \$20,000 monthly payment was reduced to approximately \$6,000 from April to August 2020. Currently our outstanding mortgage balance is \$2,356,304. The Built to Build fund raised \$189,676 over the last year.

The Board of Elders has approved a 2020 – 2021 operating budget (General Fund) of \$901,198, which represents approximately a 5% reduction from 2019 - 2020.

In closing, thank you for how you contribute and uphold ministry goals, desires, and keep the lights on through

your giving.


